

Cub Scout World Conservation Award

The World Conservation Award provides an opportunity for individual Wolf Scouts, Bear Scouts, Webelos Scouts, Scouts BSA, and Venturers to "think globally" and "act locally" to preserve and improve our environment. This program is designed to make youth members aware that all nations are closely related through natural resources, and that we and our world environment are interdependent.

Requirements for this award must be completed in addition to any similar requirements completed for rank.

Wolf Scout Requirements

You may earn the World Conservation Award by doing the following:

- 1. Earn the Paws on the Path adventure.
- 2. Select a seed, and plant it in a small container. Care for it for 30 days. Take a picture or make a drawing of your plant once a week to share with your den or family.
- 3. Find out the growing zone for your area and share the types of plants that will grow best in your zone.
- 4. Visit or research a botanical or community garden in your area and learn about two of the plants that grow there. Share what you learned with your den or family.
- 5. Make a terrarium.
- 6. Complete requirements 1 and 2 from the Spirit of the Water adventure.
- 7. Participate in a den or pack conservation project in addition to the above.

Bear Scout Requirements

You may earn the World Conservation Award by doing the following:

- 1. Earn the Fur, Feathers, and Ferns adventure.
- 2. Earn either the A Bear Goes Fishing or Critter Care adventure.
- 3. Complete requirement 3 from the Baloo the Builder adventure by constructing a bird feeder or a bird house as one of the options.
- 4. Participate in a den or pack conservation project in addition to the above.

Webelos Scout Requirements (including youth earning the Arrow of Light rank)

You may earn the World Conservation Award by doing the following:

- 1. Earn the Building a Better World adventure.
- 2. Earn the Into the Wild adventure.
- 3. Earn the Into the Woods adventure.
- 4. Earn the Earth Rocks adventure.
- 5. Outline a fair test that shows what you need to do to test a fertilizer's effect on plant growth.
- 6. Carry out the experiment you designed in requirement 5.
- 7. Carry out the experiment again but change the independent variable. Report what you learned about how changing the variable affected plant growth.
- 8. Participate in a den or pack conservation project in addition to the above.

The Award

The Cub Scout World Conservation Award, No. 139, is an embroidered emblem bearing the standard World Conservation panda on a purple fleur-de-lis. The emblem has a gold background with a blue border. It is available at your BSA local council service center. The emblem is worn centered on the right pocket of the Cub Scout uniform shirt as a temporary patch.
